

Kanani Titchen, MD, FAAP, is an Associate Physician of Adolescent Medicine at the University of California, San Diego in the Department of Academic General Pediatrics. She has expertise in human trafficking, physician education, reproductive health, eating disorders, trauma informed care, and community building. As Executive Director of Physicians Against the Trafficking of Humans, she has conducted CME-accredited human trafficking trainings at medical schools and hospital systems nationwide, produced an online CME tutorial (<https://www.doc-path.org/path>), and delivered a TED^x talk on human trafficking (<https://youtu.be/hrxhptvEOTs>). Dr. Titchen has served on committees for the American Academy of Pediatrics, American Medical Women's Association, Society for Adolescent Health and Medicine, and the North American Society for Pediatric and Adolescent Gynecology, and she is a member of HEAL Trafficking. She has authored numerous articles for medical journals and the lay press and has advocated for human trafficking survivors at the United Nations, the Department of Health and Human Services, and the New York City Mayor's Office to End Domestic and Gender-Based Violence. Dr. Titchen has spoken on television news and public radio about the need for a trauma-informed approach for working with trafficking victims and survivors. She received an AAP International Elective Award and an American Women's Hospital Service grant for her work with women and orphaned girls in Nepal. Dr. Titchen holds an MD from Sidney Kimmel Medical College at Thomas Jefferson University where she also completed her pediatrics residency, and she is a graduate of Montefiore's fellowship in Adolescent Medicine.
