## COURSE DESCRIPTION

This one-day symposium is designed for medical oncologists, general surgeons, pharmacists, nurses and other health care professionals as a review of recent advances in breast cancer diagnosis and treatments. Three guest lecturers and the Indiana University School of Medicine faculty in the field of breast cancer will share their expertise with course participants on a variety of topics relating to the care and treatment of cancer patients.

## COURSE OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this program, participants should be able to:

- Recall and discuss changes in local/regional cancer management;
- Distinguish single gene and panel testing, enumerate risk factors for germline mutations;
- Identify novel agents and enumerate the toxicities and appropriate management of patients treated with novel agents;
- List the potential benefits and risks associated with advanced breast imaging; and
- Discuss the status of immunotherapy in the treatment of breast cancer.
