Welcome to Indiana University School of Medicine’s 55th Annual Pediatric Conference. The title of the conference is, “Quality A_pc is Never an Accident: Putting Patients First.” The two-day event will focus on the safety and quality care of children and adolescents gl _pc_q md: vaping* a` sqc, vaccines* medications, and food. We will explore newborn outcomes in early cord clamping, collaborating across specialties, psychiatric emergencies and discover new ways to shape the future of children’s health.

Plenary Course Objectives: At the conclusion of the conference, participants should be able to:

- #1) Lead quality improvement projects that improve the care of children across the continuum of care.
- #2) Recognize and explain the new developments in the field of pediatric infectious diseases.
- #3) Discuss methods to improve job satisfaction for the healthcare professional to generate high quality patient-care outcomes.
- #4) Discuss the impact of racism on health and what pediatricians, educators, and parents can do to prevent racial bias from forming or mitigate its effects.
- #5) Discuss the necessity of involving the people closest to the work in solutions to quality improvement questions.

Hot Topics Objectives: At the conclusion of the conference, participants should be able to:

- #1) Recognize the significance of subtle injuries that may represent serious child abuse
- #2) Identify vaping related lung injury and counsel patients/families regarding risks of vaping.
- #3) Educate patients about the importance of a responsible gun ownership.
- #4) Describe the process of delayed cord clamping and the risks ad benefits associated with this option,

- #5) Discuss FDA regulation of infant formula, safety of international formula and its use in the United States and discuss blended diets and their safety in infant and pediatric feeding.
- #6) Practice the importance of pregnancy intention screening and basics of contraception provision.

Interactive Lecture Objectives: At the conclusion of the conference, participants should be able to:

- #1) Assess suicidal and homicidal ideation. Provide and educate physicians on suicide risk assessment, child and adolescent substance abuse and co-morbidities, psychiatric emergencies and provide referral and resource materials.
- #2) Develop new skills on how to take an identified problem and develop a key driver diagram to develop solutions.
- #3) Explain the pathway to Pediatric Rehabilitation Medicine care for patients in the State of Indiana.
- #4) Discuss the over the counter medications that can have toxicities similar to tricyclic antidepressants as well as name the opioids that have non-opioid toxicities. In addition, learners will also be able to discuss the unique toxicities of bupropion as well as the most common medication that causes hospitalization after exploratory ingestion.
- #5) Explain how car seats work, how to select one and how to explain the options to your patients.
- #6) Implement QI tools that can be used to start QI initiatives.
