COURSE OBJECTIVES: At the conclusion, participants should be able to:

- Identify approaches to assessment and care of gender-nonconformity and transgenderism in children and adolescents and learn to address their developmental trajectories.
- Describe the factors that lead to antibiotic overprescribing in the ambulatory setting.
- Identify which children would benefit from lipid screening, who to treat in the outpatient setting, and when to refer to a lipid specialist.
- Distinguish when foreign body ingestions may represent emergent situations.
- Discuss the guidelines for adolescent vaccination and contraception.
- Outline the appropriate, safe, and effective use of triptans in children and adolescents with migraine headaches.
- Explain new methods to help alleviate children’s anxieties and fears during inpatient stays.
- Recognize how evidence and data might be better used in health policy and our promotion of health.
- Identify the needs of infants with cleft lip and palate and explore how to coordinate their care with subspecialist.
- Apply enhanced skills in communicating, screening, diagnosing, and managing children and their families in areas of gender-nonconformity, obesity, parenting, gastrointestinal conditions, dermatologic disorders and healthy sleep habits in infants and toddlers.
