- Assist the non-intensivist in identifying and treating the rapidly deteriorating patient
- Assist the non-intensivist in identifying proper initial management of the critically ill patient, until transfer or appropriate critical care consultation can be arranged
- Assist house staff in preparing for ICU coverage
- Assist nurses and other critical care practitioners in identifying and appropriately reacting to the acute deterioration of the seriously and critically ill patient

## Course Objectives

At the end of this program, the participants should be able to:

- Prioritize assessment needs for the critically ill patient
- Select appropriate diagnostic tests
- Identify and respond to significant changes in the unstable patient
- Recognize and initiate management of acute life-threatening conditions
- Determine the need for expert consultation and/or patient transfer and prepare the practitioner for optimally accomplishing transfer.
